Step 4b: Narrative Underutilization Analysis

Guam is an island in the Western Pacific Ocean and is an unincorporated territory of the United States. Housing two strategic United States military bases known as Joint Region Marianas, Guam's shores provide a special location where east meets west, creating fusion of cultures and ethnicities. This brings about a diverse community with multiple ethnic origins.

The Judiciary of Guam (JOG) is the third branch of government and currently employs **429** employees. The JOG's Equal Employment Opportunity Office conducted a comparative analysis of its workforce against the community workforce of Guam and highlights the following:

1. The 2020 Census data is not available to make a clear comparison of the current Judiciary workforce analysis.
2. The Judiciary workforce as of June 2023, was comprised of **203** male employees and **226** female employees.
3. Guam's geographic location within the Pacific region supports the high representation numbers in the Pacific Islander categories.
4. The most significant underutilization for females was in the Service/Maintenance job category at -38%.
5. The most significant underutilization for males was in the Skilled Craft job category at -95%.
6. Given the small numbers of employees in the job categories of Protective Services: Sworn, Protective Services: Non-sworn, Skilled Craft, and Technicians, it is difficult to interpret the level of underutilization as significant in relation to Guam's community labor statistics.
7. Both male and females have a significant underutilization rate in the Asian ethnicities category. Males represent -48% in the "Skilled Craft" job category and Females represents -26% in the "Administrative Support" job category.
8. The Asian and White categories for males are under-represented in almost all of the job categories.
9. Guam's diversity in cultures is reflected in the positive representation of all the job categories in both the female and male census category of "Other".
10. With the 2020 Census data unavailable currently there are outliers that skew the information and interpretation of this report.

Step 5 & 6: Objectives and Steps

The Judiciary of Guam remains committed to achieving a workforce that is more representative of the community we serve and will strive to achieve this by:

1. Enhancing our outreach efforts with events such as Law Week, Mock Trial, Court Tours, Constitution Day and Career Day.
2. Encouraging careers in the Criminal Justice field by continuing our commitment to the various programs at the High School and College level such as Judicial Internships.
3. Continuing to broaden our pool of qualified applicants in the under-represented categories by posting our Job Announcements on the Judiciary of Guam website, www.guamcourts.org.
4. Continuing our dissemination of job announcements to the different local, federal, and labor agencies.
5. Continuing to monitor our recruitment and retention practices with effective resources such as the Utilization Analysis.

Step 7a: Internal Dissemination

1. Upon approval by the U.S. Department of Justice-Office for Civil Rights, the EEOP Utilization Report will be posted on the Judiciary of Guam's intranet site, an in-house electronic communication network.
2. The EEOP Utilization Report will be emailed to all employees.
3. A copy of the EEOP Utilization Report will be displayed on the Human Resources Bulletin Board.
4. A copy of the EEOP Utilization Report will be available at the EEO Office and may be obtained upon request.

Step 7b: External Dissemination

1. The bi-annual EEOP Utilization Report will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Justice-Office for Civil Rights for approval and a copy will be forwarded to the Guam Bureau of Statistics and Plans.
2. Upon approval by the Office for Civil Rights, the EEOP Utilization Report will be posted on the Judiciary of Guam's website.
3. Applicants will be informed via job announcements that they may obtain a copy of the EEOP Utilization Report from the EEO Office upon request.
4. A copy of the EEOP Utilization Report will be provided to the Guam Law Library.
5. A copy of the EEOP Utilization Report will be available at the EEO Office and may be obtained upon request.
