Below are responses to clarifications/questions in reference to the above IFB 16-01:

1. Item #1 has the specifications of onboard PRI/BRI. Can this video standard be supported in a centralized deployment rather than on each device?

Response: No, because it is not in the same building.

2. As vendors will not provide written documentation that products will not go "end of life" within the next five years, what should the bidders provide?

Response: Bidders should provide documentation from the manufacture stating if there is an end of life for this particular equipment. Documentation could be in the form of a letter from the manufacture and or brochures and or specification listing the end of life, or at minimum the product introduction date and expected refresh cycle.

3. Item #1 references video standard H.64. Please clarify this is "open" standards H.264?

Response: Please refer to section VII. (A) (1) Technical Specifications-Video Conferencing Equipment.

1. Video Standards: H.263, H264

4. Item #1-You specify a camera with 1920 x 1080 resolution.

a. Does the camera need to be licensed for the 1080p resolution out of the box?

b. Or does the camera need to support the addition of the 1080p license in the future?

Response: Camera required for this bid should be at minimum 1920 x 1080 resolution right out of the box as stated in Section VII. (A) (1).

5. Please clarify if a single video conference is for only one on one video conference or if multiple participants will be in single video conference from other locations?

Response: Video Conferencing must be capable of connecting to multiple participants at multiple locations.

6. Please clarify if multiple video conferences need to occur simultaneously?

Response: Yes, the equipment must be capable of having multiple conferences simultaneously.

7. Confirm that JOG does not need to record video conferences.


Response: No, the JOG does not need the capability of recording video conferencing.

8. Will JOG accept a solution that uses SIP services?

Response: If the equipment submitted through the bid meets the minimum requirements plus SIP then that will be acceptable but SIP alone will NOT be accepted.
