

13 On March 19, 2010, the Supreme Court of Guam through Promulgation Order 06-006-09  
14 established a Collection Court Pilot Program for the purpose of increasing judicial efficiency in  
15 the collection of restitution and fines ordered as part of a criminal defendant's sentence. The  
16 Pilot Program became effective on April 15, 2010 for a one-year period.

17  
18 Since the establishment of the Pilot Program, approximately 180 cases have been  
19 converted from criminal cases to collection cases, or "RS" cases. A subcommittee was formed  
20 to review and evaluate the effectiveness of the Pilot Program. The subcommittee is currently  
21 considering the participation of the Office of the Attorney General, and is also reviewing internal  
22 court procedures in the operation of the Collections Court. In order to afford a full and proper  
23 evaluation of the Collections Court and its effectiveness, an extension of the Pilot Program is  
24 necessary.


26 **NOW, THEREFORE,** pursuant to the administrative authority of the Supreme Court of
