12 On March 19, 2010, the Supreme Court of Guam through Promulgation Order 06-006-09

13 established a Collection Court Pilot Program for the purpose of increasing judicial efficiency in

14 the collection of restitution and fines ordered as part of a criminal defendant's sentence. The

15 Pilot Program became effective on April 15, 2010 and has been extended through December 31,

16 2014. See Promulgation Order PR06-006-15.

18 The subcommittee continues to review internal court procedures in the operation of the

19 Collections Court including the participation of the Office of the Attorney General for the

20 criminal cases currently assigned to the Collections Court. In order to afford a full and proper

21 evaluation of the Collections Court and its effectiveness, an extension of the Pilot Program is

22 necessary.

25 NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the administrative authority of the Supreme Court of

26 Guam over the Judiciary in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, 48 U.S.C. §

27 1424-1(a)(6), this court hereby approves an extension of the Collections Court Pilot Program

1 adopted in Miscellaneous Rule 1.4 of the Local Rules of Court for the Superior Court of Guam
2 which shall be effective January 1, 2015 and remain in effect until the adoption of permanent
3 rules or further order of this court.
