PROMULGATION ORDER

The Supreme Court of Guam has revisited the Rules Governing Admission to the Practice of Law and has proposed that amendments be made to Rules 3.01(d) and 8.01(e)(2), to correct, respectively, an error in reference the time period within which an applicant for admission may transfer scores for the Multi-State Professional Responsibility Exam, and the applicable fee for *pro hac vice* applications. These amendments reflect non-substantive changes to these rules.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority to “govern ...the practice of law in Guam, including admission to practice law and the conduct and discipline of persons admitted to practice law,” 48 U.S.C. § 1424-1(a)(7), the Supreme Court hereby amends and restates Rules 3.01(d) and 8.01(e)(2), respectively, to read as follows (amendments underlined):

**Rule 3.01. Application for Admission by Examination.**

(d) MBE transfers from earlier Guam administrations of the examination or from another jurisdiction are not accepted; however, scores of 80 scaled MPRE, or higher may be

1 transferred from other jurisdictions for up to two years after the test date on which the  
2 passing score was achieved. Upon passing the Guam Bar Examination, an applicant must  
3 successfully sit for the MPRE examination within two (2) years of the test dates during  
4 which he/she passed the Guam Bar Examination.

5 **Rule 8.01. Admission in Pending Litigation before a Court or Agency.**


6 (e) Application.



8 (1) Required Information. An application shall state the information listed on Appendix  
9 A to this rule. The applicant may also include any other matters supporting admission pro  
10 hac vice.

11 (2) Application Fee. An applicant for permission to appear as counsel pro hac vice  
12 under this Rule shall provide a non-refundable fee in accordance with the current fee  
13 schedule as determined by the Judicial Council, which shall be payable to the Supreme  
14 Court of Guam, located on the third floor of the Guam Judicial Center, at the time of filing  
15 the application. The applicant shall furnish proof of payment to the court where the  
16 application is filed.

17 These Rules, as amended and restated, shall be permanently adopted and effective as of this  
18 date.
