On November 4, 2010, the Judicial Council of Guam approved a resolution recommending the creation of the DWI Court Project by the Supreme Court of Guam as a pilot project commencing November 15, 2010 through December 31, 2011. See JC 10-027. On November 10, 2010, the Supreme Court of Guam adopted PRM 10-004 establishing the DWI Court as a separate docket for the purpose of consolidating all drunk driving charges before one judge, and supported by federal funding from the National Highway Traffic & Safety Administration, Office of Highway Safety, Department of Public Works, Grant #AL11-01-07.

At the December 2011 meeting of the Judicial Council, DWI Court Judge Elizabeth A. Barrett-Anderson reported on the operational success of the pilot program in 2010-2011. She reported successful outcomes of the DWI Court project, but revealed that in order to continue the project, certain issues such as judge assigning and case calculation need to be further examined. Judge Barrett-Anderson requested a limited extension of the Pilot program for purposes of determining logistical issues of the DWI Court continuation. The Judicial Council recommended continuation of the pilot program for 60 days from December 31, 2011.

On December 13, 2011, the Clerk of the Supreme Court gave notice to the Guam Bar Association that the continuation of the DWI Court program would be presented to the Supreme Court of Guam as recommended by the Judicial Council.
