

On November 10, 2010 the DWI Court was established for the purpose of creating a separate docket to consolidate cases involving driving under the influence charges before one or more judges. The DWIC Executive Committee, in its DWIC Project Report, has recommended the continuation of the DWI Court Project, and/or the establishment of the DWI Court as a permanent court of record for the Judiciary of Guam. The recommendation was based on the successful outcomes of original project goals and objectives of the DWIC Project as stated in the Project Report submitted to the Judicial Council of Guam, dated December 12, 2011. The DWI Court project was extended through December 31, 2014. *See* PRM 10-004-005. Based on the number of filings for the DWI Court since the creation of the DWI docket in 2010, the Clerk of Court for the Superior Court has recommended that the separate docket for DWI cases be extended for six (6) months. Before the expiration of six (6) months, the DWIC Executive Committee will provide a report which will assist in determining whether the DWI Court should remain a permanent court of record for the Superior Court of Guam.

1 NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the administrative authority of the Supreme Court of
2 Guam over the Judiciary in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, 48 U.S.C. §
3 1424-1(a)(6), this court hereby approves an extension of the DWI Court which shall be effective
4 January 1, 2015 and remain in effect until the adoption of a permanent DWI Court or further
5 order of this court.
