RESOLUTION NO. JC16-012

RELATIVE TO COMMENDING JOSHUA F. TENORIO ON BECOMING A FELLOW OF THE INSTITUTE FOR COURT MANAGEMENT

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2016, Administrator of the Courts Joshua F. Tenorio graduated from the Institute for Court Management (“ICM”) Fellows program, a rigorous certification program that is administered by the National Center for State Courts; and

WHEREAS, completion of the ICM Fellows programs requires that participants complete four distinct academic phases: achievement of Certified Court Manager status, achievement of Certified Court Executive status, the Court Project Phase, and the Presentation Phase; and

WHEREAS, each phase requires the participants to build on the knowledge they have gained through their professional experience to develop skills necessary to be effective managers and leaders in their respective court systems; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Tenorio’s submission as part of the Court Project Phase was entitled, “Embracing Evidence-Based Practices: Implementing Change in Probation,” and highlighted the major reform efforts occurring in the Judiciary’s Probation Services Division; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Tenorio was given the distinct honor of being selected by members of his ICM fellow class to deliver the class address at a graduation ceremony that was held at the United States Supreme Court.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED that the Judicial Council expresses its sincere congratulations to Mr. Tenorio on his achievement, which is a reflection of the dedication to the administration of justice of both the Judiciary and himself.
